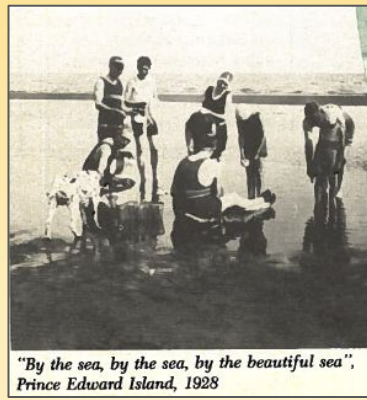

The Famous Five were: Emily Murphy, Nellie McClung, Louise McKinney, Irene Parlby, Henrietta Edwards.

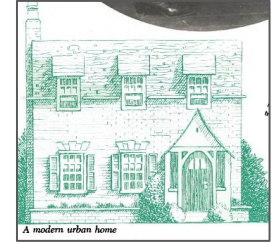
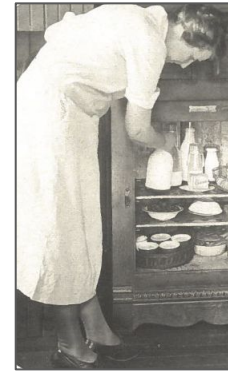

Winter fun for the family in Montreal



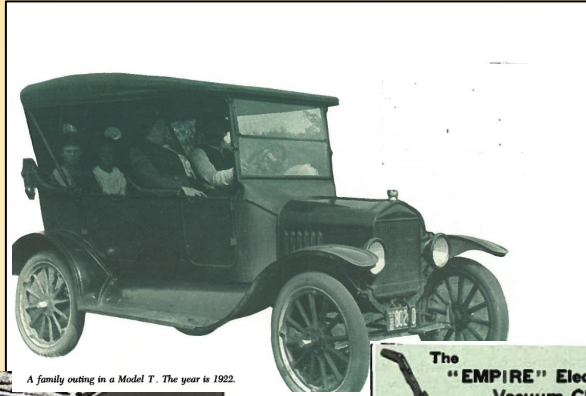
A modern urban home

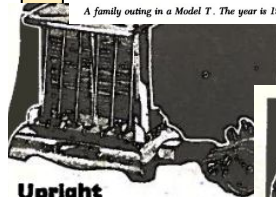
Innovation/ Technological Advancements

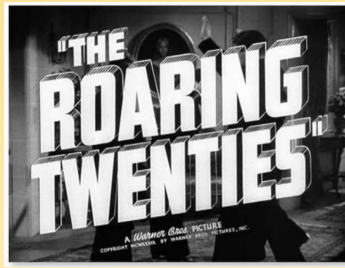
